THE LEADERSHIP CONNECTION

Christians at every age and stage of life yearn to know their purpose and wonder how they can impact the world for good. Most underestimate their value and God-given potential, missing the "good work" God prepared for them to accomplish. The *Leadership Connection* empowers them to identify and passionately pursue their purpose in God's Kingdom.

PREDICTED OUTCOMES

Participants of the Leadership Connection:

1. Develop an appreciation for the breadth of God's work in all areas of life.
2. Understand that they are mission-critical to God's Kingdom agenda.
3. Develop a design profile, based on their unique giftedness, that identifies specifically how God created them to work and how he expects them to contribute.
4. Understand in practical ways how they can apply their design profile when making decisions about work, ministry, and relationships.
5. Dream about what God might do for them, through them, with them, and in them.
6. Identify specific Kingdom contributions God may want them to make.
7. Set goals and create an action plan to move toward their Kingdom purpose.
8. Develop a deeper motivation for their own spiritual growth, realizing the important role they were created to play in God's Kingdom.
9. When presented with opportunities, they say "Yes" with conviction and "No" without guilt because they have an objective way to discern God's will for their lives.

LEADERSHIP CONNECTION COURSE OVERVIEW

Phase One: Community

Community environment develops as participants trace and share their life stories and how God has worked in their life thus far. Peer relationships are an important component of the process that leads each individual to identify his or her calling.

Phase Two: Perspective

Participants develop a biblical perspective of calling, work, ministry, and God's kingdom purposes. They discover the breadth of God's work and the variety of ways He might choose to use them. They learn that the key characters in God's redemption story are not in full-time vocational ministry.

Phase Three: Discovery

Using SIMA* gift-assessment technology, participants identify their God-given natural and spiritual abilities, and create a design profile based on their individual giftedness.

Phase Four: Direction

Participants embrace and explore practical applications of their design and begin the planning process to align their lives with God's calling.

Phase Five: Implementation

A mentor is assigned to each participant upon course completion. Participants also meet periodically as a group for mutual encouragement, offering insights to each other as they pursue God's calling.
